Freshman Year:

Junior Year:

- Compile list of 25-30 potential medical schools
- Begin medical school application

Summer before Senior:

- Submit medical school application JUNE 1st

- Possible medical school interviews
- Maintain high GPA and involvement
- Send letters to potential schools with updates
