 - Is project designed only for corn?
 - For design purposes the project is only for corn, however could scale for other grain.
 - Sorghum, what is it?
 - Cross of wheat and corn for animals.
 - Lots of money has poured into corn. It's a high tech crop
 - Sorghum is very similar to corn except more hardy and requires less water.
 - Sorghum is beginning to become popular to feed animals in poorer soils and less water.
 - Mostly researched by universities (public crop)
 - At the projects 3rd stage of development what will it need?
 - Handheld
 - Data Logging
 - Battery Powered
 - In 2nd stage using the device do we need to measure to the ground?
 - No, but a certain place must be decided to puncture on all stalks
 - In the corn there are stress concentration points above nodes due to the change in diameter. Also above each node is a growth zone – new tissue grows on the old.
 - Also nutrients will be pulled from stalk when corn ears are maturing.
 - It will probably be best to count down nodes from the ear for the testing point.
 - One hand or two handed device?
 - One person operation, however that must be done.
 - How much memory is needed?
 - Only text files are needed so should get by with little memory.
 - Will insertion angle and velocity be important?
 - We will need to see,
 - Probably 90 degrees insertion will be best.
 - Rate shouldn't be a problem as long as you have fast data collection.
 - Using the needle we can measure diameter and rind thickness
 - How should we apply the needle?
 - Hand force would be best.
 - However a crank would work.
 - The needle will act as a caliper for outside diameter
 - In the past several different types have been tried

- Blunt, Rounded, or Taper
- Has Lancing been considered?
 - It has been considered but will most likely be too thin and will bend.
 - Nothing was consistent for measuring rind penetration.
 - Peak of graph was not consistent with any one point.
 - With a needle we can find when it starts to penetrate and when it leaves.
 - We will need a plate to reference where back of stalk is.
 - Full penetration because we can get the rind thickness from the second penetration.
 - Bigger moment of inertia less bend
 - Ad^2
 - Instead of using cross area we could use area under stress curve
 - It works because of material change
 - We can measure inertia this way.
 - BACK MUST BE SUPPORTED
 - Used as a reference to when needle penetrates all the way through.
 - Scale of measurement millimeters
 - Should penetration angle be included in calculation?
 - We'll have to find out
- Will we need to figure out a machining process for the needle?
 - Probably, but we need to talk to the machine shop
 - Length of needle 1-2 inches
