 Unitronics High Speed Input Output IO Module: UID-0808THS Quadrature Mode: 200kHz Max - t_p = 5μs minimum Max speed at 65,536 CPR = 3rps = 0.59 inch/s = 25s/15 inches

<u>TR2 Linear Encoder</u>

Accuracy±0.0005inch/inch max accumulated error

~15 inches (max distance) = ±0.0075inch

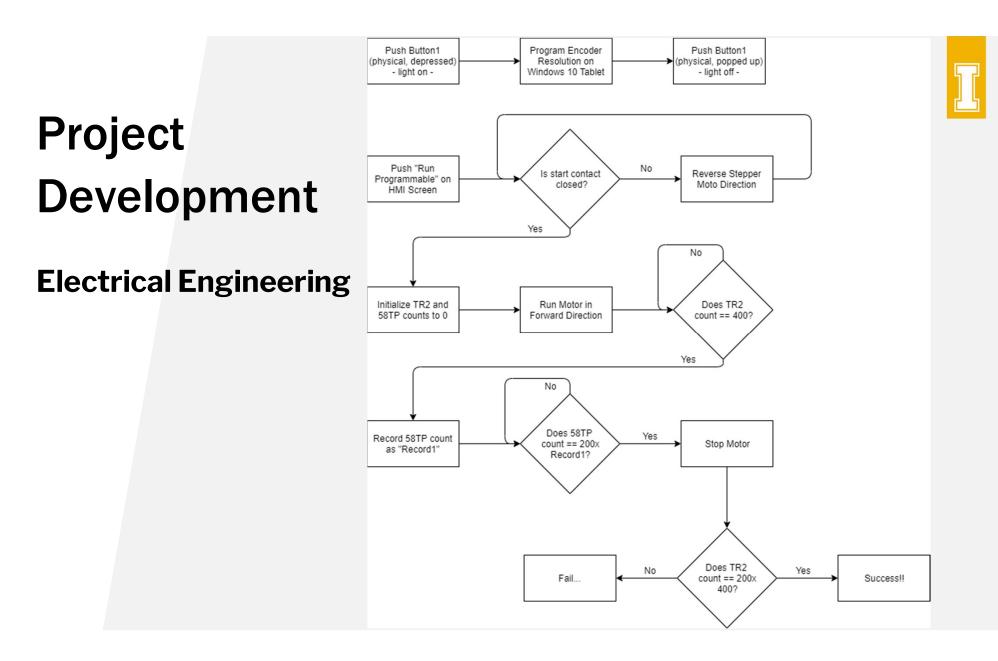
- <u>Ball Screw:</u> 5mm/ cycle repeat positioning accuracy: ± 0.0008inch
- <u>Nema 23 Motor:</u> 200 steps/ cycle

0.001inch increments ±0.00005inch

• <u>58TP:</u> Programmable 1 - 65,536 CPR

400 CPR will easily provide exact Nema 23 step location

User input =be divided by 128 (2⁷) to increase usable range to 51,200 CPR





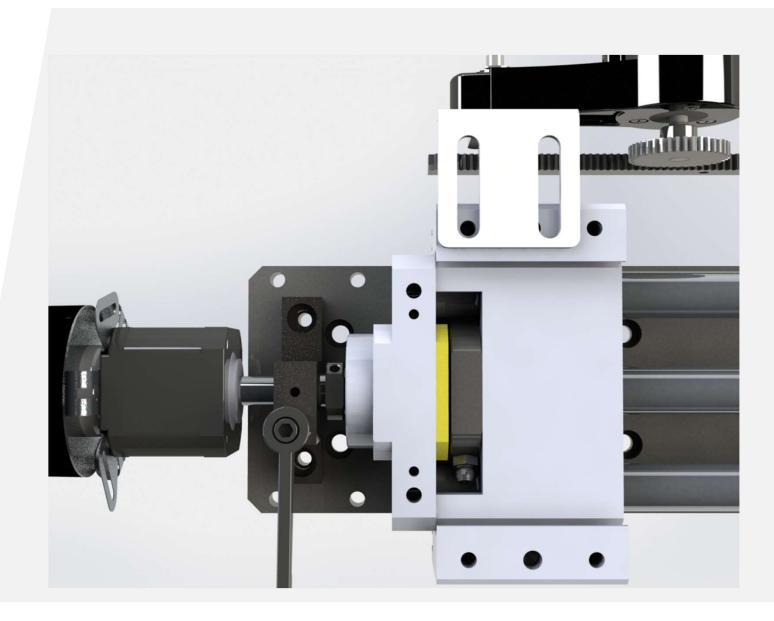
Project Challenges

- Advanced looping and interrupt routines using ladder logic thru UniLogic
- Using the TR2 for direct linear measurement vs. second 58TP
