Brandon presenting his new "Reese's rotating" Design to group

Carissa presents new update on syringe design, replacing syringes with twist top Eppendorf tubes that are Forensic DNA Grade

Discussion-

Positive to look at new ideas- Dr.Law

Remarks on Reese's Design:

- This device collects through media- where does the air exit? These need to be thought out and this also conflicts with the compressed gas motion idea for sealing.
- Dr. Law is sceptic of the rotation "This is a beginning of an idea. But needs to be expanded."
- Gause Johnson laboratory, first floor has the wind tunnel to test Reese's Design
- Maybe two different collection medias could be advantageous for the first flight simulation to determine which is the superior collection media. Filter paper has been determined to be the easiest we have determined there is approximately 1 microbe in each liter of air

Pros of accent sampling- more time, more stable

• It seems the team agrees that we want to carry on with all designs intending to sample on the accent.

Pros of decent sampling- more air flow velocity.

Going Over Eppendorf Design-

- 10^3- 10^4 total cells per cubic meter are in the stratosphere
- This information is from Mareyna. This is VERY key information, after calculating microbial density we are looking at 1-10 microbes in one liter of air (m^3=1000L)
- This fact leads us to TOSS out the Eppendorf and syringe design
- Mareyna thinks not having DNA media is not a peril problem

Fornia Lab- Life Science South on campus is where the DNA replication and sequencing is done.

(PCR is preset for how many amplifications of DNA is done when the sampling is being tested in the lab)

Going over the Microcontrollers-

You do need licensed to have radio and communications, we need amateur radio licenses

- Dev says if we have a device that does not interrupt signal, Lowest priority signal, we do not need license. Talk to Caleb about how this process works, he can put you in contact with people of the communications.
- battery source must survive the environment. Team currently used 14.7 Volts
- Get cost estimate for iridium tracking
- keep this simple Joe-law doesn't seem to like the Reese's design.
- design review is in three weeks solid design needs to be finished- so the microelectronics
- things that are still unknowns, tracking system, high and low altitude GPS, spot tracker is a satellite-based system that is a great locator
- SPOT Is another location system and is approximately \$500
- Start document for weight of components

Intro Alex questions about temperature profile of the stratosphere

- Dev temperature minimum of stratosphere is negative 60 degrees Fahrenheit
- Sensor environment may need to be in a warmer environment during sampling, a thermocouple may be needed to adjust for true air reading because of their refence temperature.
- Some sensor that have been found are not rated for below negative 55 degrees.
- Dev says to keep looking for the sensor portion of the project

Contact Vast president or Micheal adkins for reverence for the sensors to use with this temperature.

- **RTD** very small temperature sensors should be suitable for the project.
- **Humidity** sensor is very difficult to find, due to temperature range. Many temperature and humidity are combined sensors. PLUS at this altitude the water is frozen so what is the advantage of measuring humidity? **Solid state humidity measurements?? How??**

Impactor design Papers

- The air flow models of these articles are very important. We don't know how the flow rate is going to be affected when we make up our own new designs. Flow is so crucial in these designs
- Rotate the top of Brandon's Design to make it more similar to the impactor design
- Incorporator 45 degrees angle to top of Brandon's design or even 90 degrees air flow
- Reynolds Number will be needed, and we want turbulence to break the boundary layer.
- A laminar flow would not expose the entire air flow into the sampling unit.

There needs to be a feedback to the controller that the design has opened. Consider limit switch that will indicate that the sampler has actually opened this switch then needs to send signal that confirms it has opened.

Make software as robust as possible there are always problems you don't see until you try to start using them.

Remember that you need to subtract starting altitude from the ground, Tator Tots has this problem.
