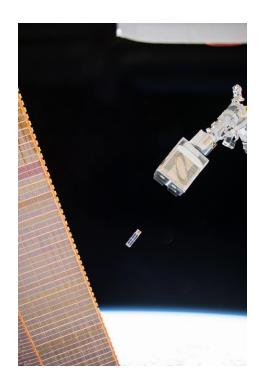






Background: TechEdSat

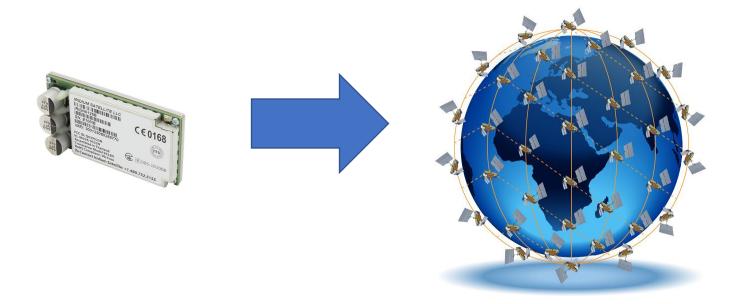
- TechEdSat: Technology Education Satellite
- What?: Investigation to employ small CubeSat spacecraft
- Why?: To evaluate, demonstrate, and validate new technologies





Background: Iridium 9523

- Iridium 9523: A consumer voice and data satellite transceiver module (from a satellite phone)
- What?: Communicates with the Iridium satellite constellation
- Why?: Can establish a full internet connection to a ground network via:
 - SBD: Similar to text messaging
 - RUDICS: Similar to a data plan





- The cost of common satellite radios are normally in the tens of thousands of dollars.
- By switching to an off-the-shelf satellite network, the cost for future NASA satellite missions will be drastically reduced.

Objective

To develop the software for one of the CubeSat's microcontrollers to establish a live data connection via the Iridium Network for an upcoming TechEdSat mission.

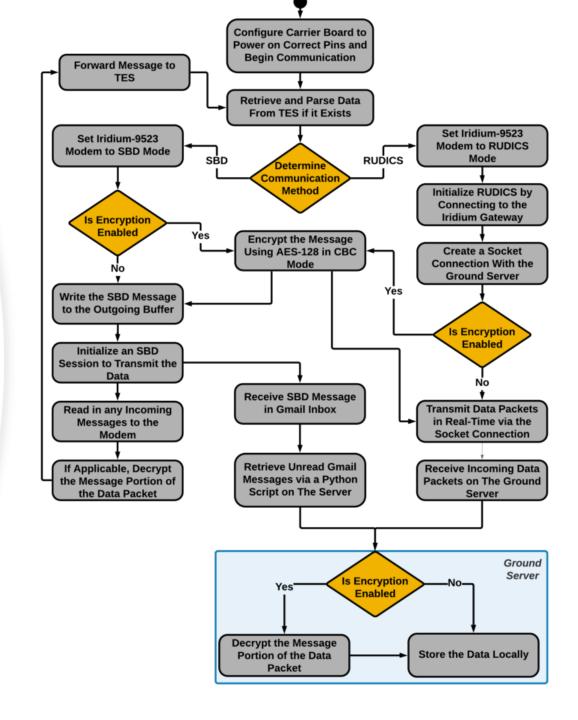

Baseline Project Requirements

- Sample temperature every second and power consumption every 30 seconds.
- Able to turn off at any time if 9523 overheats.
- Send status messages of modem and board.
- Transmit randomly generated data via SBD and RUDICS to a ground server.

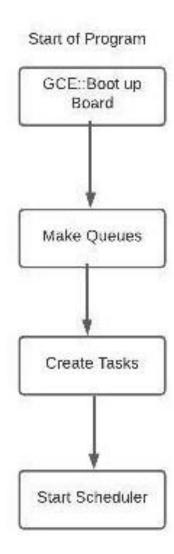

Software Libraries

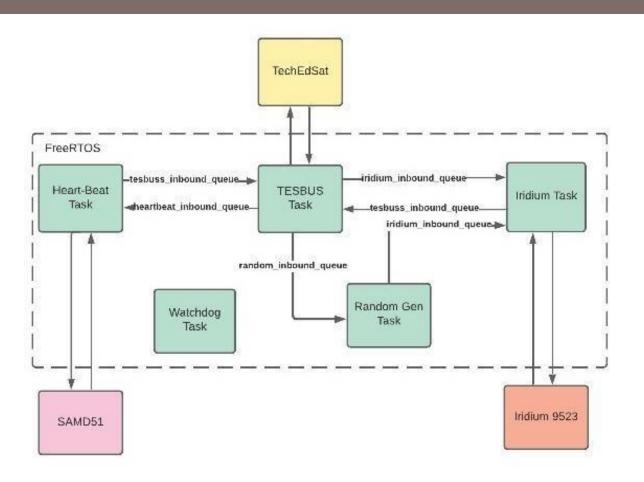
- **GrandCentral**: Board functions such as sensors
- **SerialTransfer:** Serial communication for Arduino
- IridiumSBD: Modified to add RUDICS support
- **FreeRTOS_SAMD51**: Free RTOS
- **SleepyDog:** Hardware watchdog timer for errors
- All libraries are open source

FreeRTOS

- Real Time Operating System.
- Like windows, but for microprocessors.
- Allows us to create multiple tasks that run at the same time.



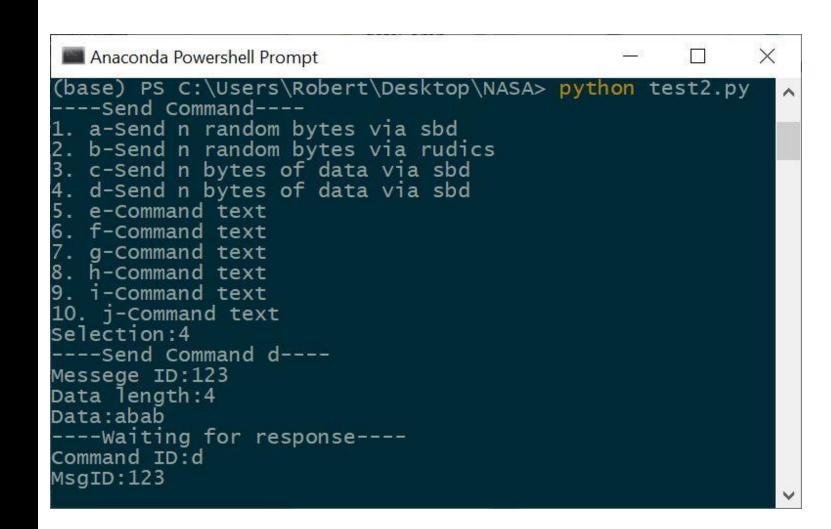
Tasks



- Heartbeat Task
 - Reports temputure, signal quality, etc
- TESBUS Task
 - Communicates with primary satellite computer
- Iridium Task
 - Controls 9523 modem
- RandomGen Task
- Watchdog Task

TESBUS demo:

- Custom built testing software
- Sent commands and received responses from microprocessor
- Sent via a USB to serial adapter directly to the pins on the microchip

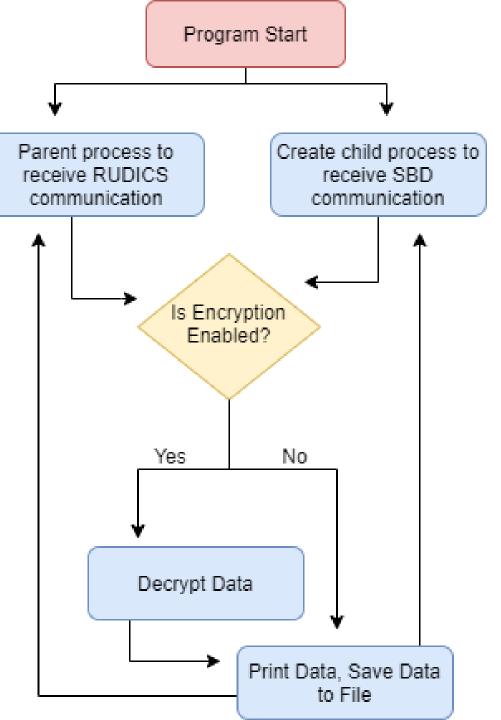


Ground Server Application

- Post-process information
- Receive Both SBD or RUDICS communication
- Longevity

Ground Server

- Ubuntu Digital Ocean Server
 - 1 GB Memory, 25 GB Disk
 - Static Public IP address
 - Security
 - Firewall
 - Antivirus Software



Python Code Breakdown

- Create child process for SBD communication
 - Binds designated port to host IP address
 - LOOP
 - Listen to receive communication
 - Print received communication to the screen and append to log file
- Parent process used for RUDICS communication

Clean up the collection of data



Rewrite the program to work on a single port

NASA requirement:	Achieved by:
Communication with primary satellite computer	Verifying TESBUS task is functioning
Verification of expected signal quality based on position	Sending current time in the message
Integrity of data transferred	Error detection byte within each message
Volume of data transferred	Sequential message IDs
Changing between SBD and RUDICS mode	Verifying Iridium task is functioning
