- Arm design was discussed
  - Octopus Leg
    - With the octopus leg there are worries that it might not be able to withstand the conditions of the Met Box.
    - Octopus leg may not be able to support the camera and shielding, but is cheap and malleable.
  - Metal Arm
    - Wench could be made out of stainless steel to support the camera and shielding
    - Twister would would be added on the end to allow for more possible angles
    - Due to weight constraints, this design would have to be specced accordingly.
- Agreed the arm and mount parts should be permanent features
- The design will henceforth be split up into three parts:
  - Camera & Shielding, which will be designed by Nick
  - Arm, which will be designed by David
  - Wall Mount, which will be designed by Jack

  - Densetec quote has been completed, and Jack is waiting to hear back for it.
  - 3:30 on Tuesday in the Think Tank Conference rooms time slot will be alloted for next semester.
    - Important to note that this time is during the Capstone Design class and if there is any session commencing, we will have to accomodate.
  - CAD and Solidworks modeling and training will be performed next semester.

  - Should have prototype built before we leave back to Idaho National Labs in March
  - Along with octopus arms and desk lamp arm, David has designed an arm prototype that involves several pins and single connectors

- Octopus leg arms reach 9 inches in length, meaning it fits the length requirements for arm prototype.
- Nick has found a camera worth \$599
  - Speculated camera is a Marshall CV350-10XB that weighs 375g and has a 10X zoom
  - If necessary, we could buy the camera and return it if it doesn't meet our requirements
- Discussed how the prototype we are building will not be entered into the Met Box itself, due to the lack of actual radiation resistant shielding for camera.
  - Prototype will contain mock shielding not meant to permanently be held in the met box, mostly used as a representation

- 1/17/19 Meeting 14 3:30-4:00
  - New camera problem: possible overheating if kept on too long
    - Simple solution is to have an easy off switch to the camera which can performed with \$30 wiring.
  - Filament for 3D printing needs to be purchased
  - Base design for the contraption now includes a higher placement for the magnet so that there is room for an off switch for such magnet
  - In base design there needs to be an additional leg/magnet in order to keep the system steady
  - Joints for original arm may be difficult to craft as it is hard to create sticky screw joints
  - David had shower idea of creating a single ball joint arm design
    - Consider a shower head system or even a single ball joint or the previously outlined octopus arm idea.
    - Need to know the material of the ball joint contraption for radiation resistance
    - Ball joint would be attached to the base, not the camera
    - This idea seems to be the one that the team wants to move forward with.
  - Some plastics do have radiation resistance, making the octopus leg a possible design for our contraption

- The make of the octopus arm material can be found, however registering and using the equipment needed, Raman or IR spectroscopy, will take a lot of time

- Model will be 3D printed for the engineering release

  - Camera had been order and specs are known
    - Weight is only a single pound
    - Camera has overheating problem, but can be simply fixed with easy off switch
  - Need to figure out wiring system for zoom and regular application
    - Regular application uses USB2 port
    - Zoom uses HDMI or 3G/HD-SDI port
    - Will be impossible to find HDMI wiring with insulation
    - Wiring and ports needs to be considered for computer as there may be signal loss due to long length of wires and multiple connections
    - Coax port is preferred by INL, may be able to use a transition port to make this work
  - Camera cording does not need to be insulated for the Met Box
  - Secondary visit date to INL needs to be determined
  - Hard Plastic radiation resistance and wiring schematics are to be sent to us from INL to help with design
    - Elimination of octopus leg design will depend on data
  - Ball joint idea is accepted by INL
  - Prepare for second design review on Feb 15th
  - Action Items:

- 2/7/19 Meeting 16 3:25-3:40
  - Idea of press fitting the nipple in the center of the arm onto the two ball joints, then securing the bar with an external screw.
  - Center nipple may be able to be found with the correct threads
    - Might be able to be found online or at Clearwater Hydraulics in Lewiston
      - Here we can find more pieces that just the simple nipple piece
    - Nipple piece could be created for a rather inexpensive price.
  - Ball joints are made of chrome plated brass, threads are G 1/2
    - The soft metal may make it hard to perform certain techniques
      - Heavy machining and/or loads could cause it to collapse
      - Welding the materials with stainless steel or other unifilar metals could cause problems.
  - Idea to weld the post to the first ball joint
    - Could be problematic considering brass is the materials needing to be welded
  - Possibility to find a ball joint piece that doesn't use G 1/2 threads
    - Ball joint was found that uses universal 1/2 threads
  - We will use a certain amount of foil, low weight, for protection of the electronics in the back of the camera.
  - Possible time for Engineering release is Wednesday the 20th at 1:00
    - This gives INL and us time to prepare
  - A metal piece will be inserted in the back of the post, by welding or bolting, in order to keep it stable
  - Action Items:

      - Finish on final proofed design

- 2/14/19 Meeting 17 3:30-3:52
  - Machineable nipple can be found by Clearwater
    - This allows us to screw into the G 1/2 threads found in the ball joints with ease rather than press fitting any pieces
    - MSC has 6 inch long nipple that costs \$18
      - This is great compared to a rethreaded nipple that could cost \$400
  - CableCreation has cable boosters that may help with signal distortion
  - Use a scrap piece in the shop for post balance
  - Idea to use two press-fit pieces for the male side of the ball joint in order to attach to the post convert to camera and shielding threads
  - Idea to make a pin that fits the inside diameter of the male end of the ball joint, the use a set screw to keep it in place.
  - Idea to attack ball joint by turning down the male end and press fitting a piece into it.

- Due to the piece being brass and the action of turning down the threads causing the thickness of the piece to be too thin, this procedure was vetoed
- Idea to find a cup link with the correct threads for the male end of the ball joint.
  - This piece was found and know will fit into the final design of our project.
- It is necessary to 3D print the knob piece to attach to the magnet
- Provide all the details for the system for the engineering release, including specific materials, costs, and measurements.

  - Need information on Clearview Panel
    - Density?
    - Price?
    - Frame Material?
    - Custom Options?
    - How thick can we get the actual material?
    - Weight of the clearview panel with the frame?
  - Once we have information on clearview panel, need to come to decision on shielding design and how to implement the Clearview panel.
    - Should we use it for the entirety of the shielding or simply for the front?
  - From engineering release, we need to buy nipple and then test the loading capability of the actual nipple.

- Nipple has been received, need to do load testing on the on the arm piece with the given part
- Need to design a post plate with a defined bend part
- Note to not send in drawings without being 100% certain on the final design, also would want to confer with INL before moving forward.
- Instead of sending in parts for shielding to be tapped and cut at some company, there is an idea to do the machining ourselves to prevent problems with laser hardening.
- Holes to safen magnet are not to be through holes, but instead to be tapped
- Actual magnet holes need to be oversized to make sure that they will allow the magnets to fit.
- Ordered BSPT male, so the parts can go tapered to female.
- Decision was made to only use the clearview panel for the front of the shielding design due to the clumsiness of having to use it for the entire design
  - 2.5\*2.5\*2.5 in block will be used for the front coming to weight of around 2lbs
  - Was advised to use 3.5 in wide block to allow for more radiation resistance, but due to weight constraints 2.5in block will be used giving around 80% radiation reduction
  - The clearview block can have a polycarbonate casing, of about ¼ of an inch, allowing for the metal casing to be eliminated
  - Will use stand-in for clearview piece as it will cost around \$2000 on its own
- Need to find a way to make sure that screws used will stay in tightly,
  - Possibly lockwash
- Need to order camera to start interfacing with the system, using multiple chords together

    - Edit solidworks design to account for oversize magnet holes and screw safety

- 3/7/19 Meeting 20 3:30-4:02
  - Arm piece can not even remotely handle the load of the camera with shielding, ball joints simply can not handle the moment created

- Hydraulic strut was designed to be attached to the bend point of the post piece to help with the weight of the camera and shielding
  - This hydraulic strut may need to be bigger to accommodate for weight, easily amenable
  - Bent post and shielding is tapped in order to allow attachment for hydraulic strut.
- To eliminate the need to screw on the camera and shielding piece, Nick has designed a basket to hold the camera
  - Basket is made of aluminum sheet metal
    - It would be useful to find the actual type of Aluminum, posed to probably be 4XXX series
  - Basket is meant to be bent into place
    - Need to know if sheet metal will crack when bent to 90 degrees
  - Folds of basket meant to keep it in place for radical angles
- Need to attach wing so that the manipulators can easily lift the camera and shielding
  - Camera and shielding is to wide to be held by manipulators
- Plan on having a conference call with INL on Wednesday March 20th in order to order parts very soon afterwards
- Shielding is thin enough to tap and cut through.
- Idea to add tabs to the aluminum basket so that we do not need to accommodate the hydraulic strut with extra aluminum black to tap
  - Tabs would be cut out of the sheet metal basket and the holes cut into them
  - These holes would be bolted to hydraulic strut and arm piece
- Idea to make basket wider so that holes could be cut in extra space, then bolted
- Need to order wiring connectors and USD chord

- 3/20/19 Meeting 21/INL Conference Call 1:00-1:30
  - Reported to INL about new design features
    - Talked about Clearview front, 2.5\*2.5\*2.5 cube
    - Talked about hydraulic strut used to keep up shielding and camera
    - Talked about aluminum 4XXX basket to keep camera in place
    - Talked about tabs and wing used on the basket and shielding to allow for less tapping and easy maneuverability
    - Talked about the addition of a second magnet to allow for more load bearing capability

- Moment diagram used in presentation needs updating and is integral for determining total load that the system might have
- INL is happy with new design, especially the quality of requiring less manufacturing and having more mobility
- Stainless Steel pieces will be machined by a seperate company instead of here at the university of Idaho
- 3/21/19 Meeting 22 3:31-3:55
  - Top piece of the stainless steel shielding has a protruding tab so that manipulators can easily grab the box
    - Screwed on tab was removed from the design
  - Moment diagram was fixed
    - For a 30 degree angle, a specific hydraulic strut is needed to keep up the force
    - Calculated a minimum of 24 degrees before strut will no longer hold the box
  - Gas may need to be released to allow for the manipulators to maneuver the cameras
  - The small details designed on the basket are to bent with pliers into place
  - Need to round down the top edges of the shielding
  - $\circ$   $\,$  Add lockwashes and weld nuts to the design
  - Need to create flat patterns in completely accurate form
    - Example: change hole in the bracket to just a through-hole
    - Plan to have these done by tomorrow
  - Idea to go above 1/8 inch for shielding through-holes
    - Allows to go from 0.25 to 0.15 tolerance
  - Action Items:
    - Nick
      - Work on flat patterns so that stainless steel and aluminum pieces can be cut
      - Send patterns to INL
    - David
      - Work on flat patterns so that stainless steel and aluminum pieces can be cut
      - Order given metal pieces
    - Jack
      - Work on documentation: wikipage, final report, design poster
