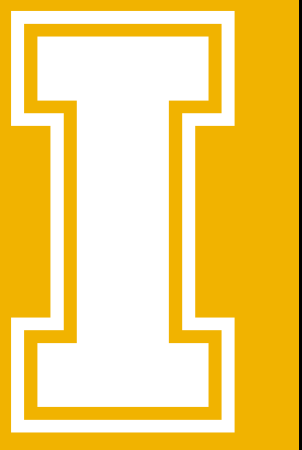


# INDEPENDENTLY RAN RENEWABLE INTEGRATED SYSTEM

- Code tested on relay board before LEDs for streamline troubleshooting

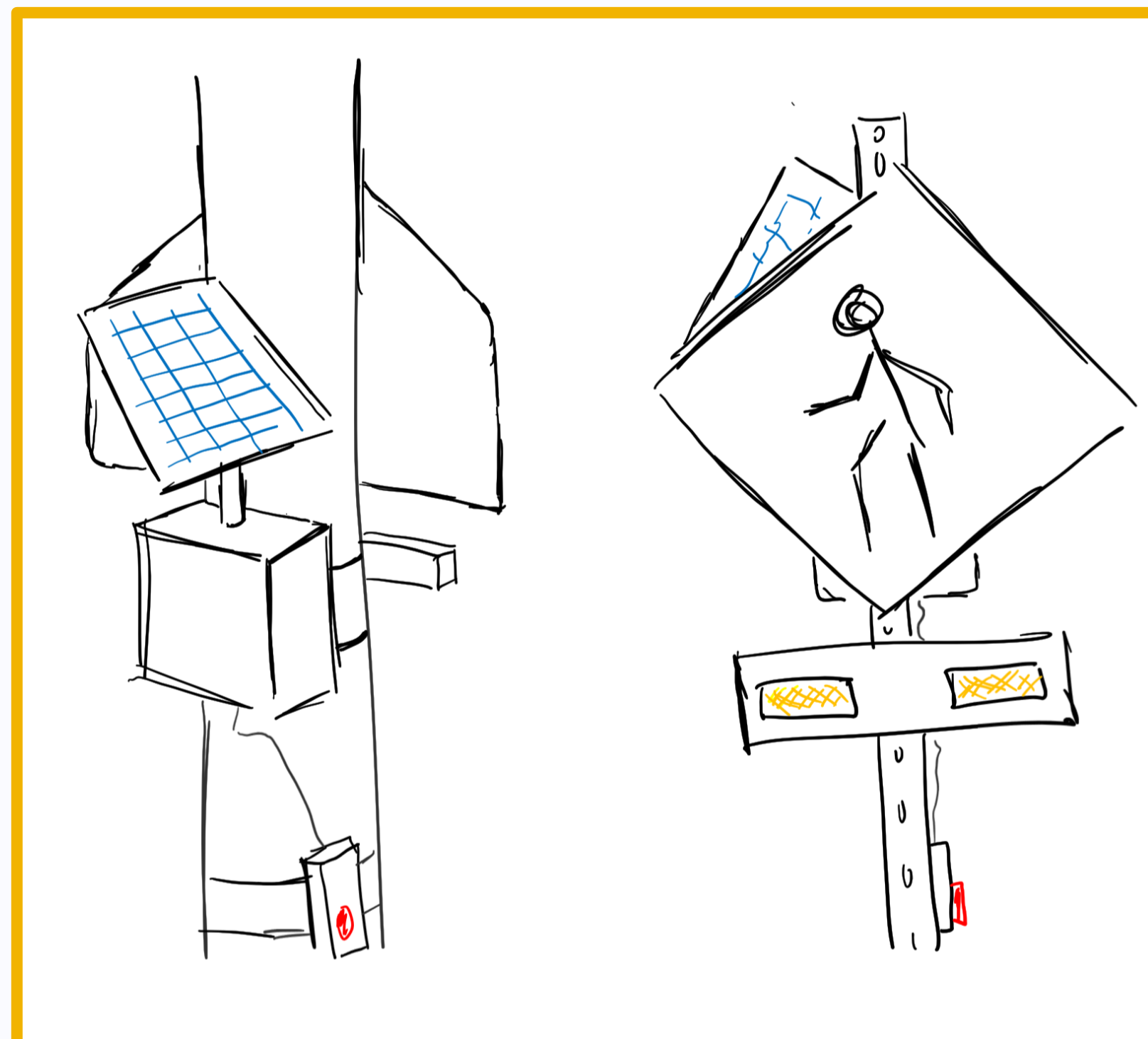
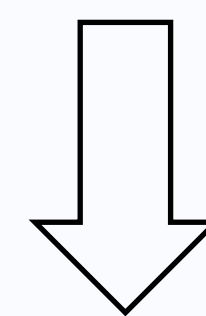
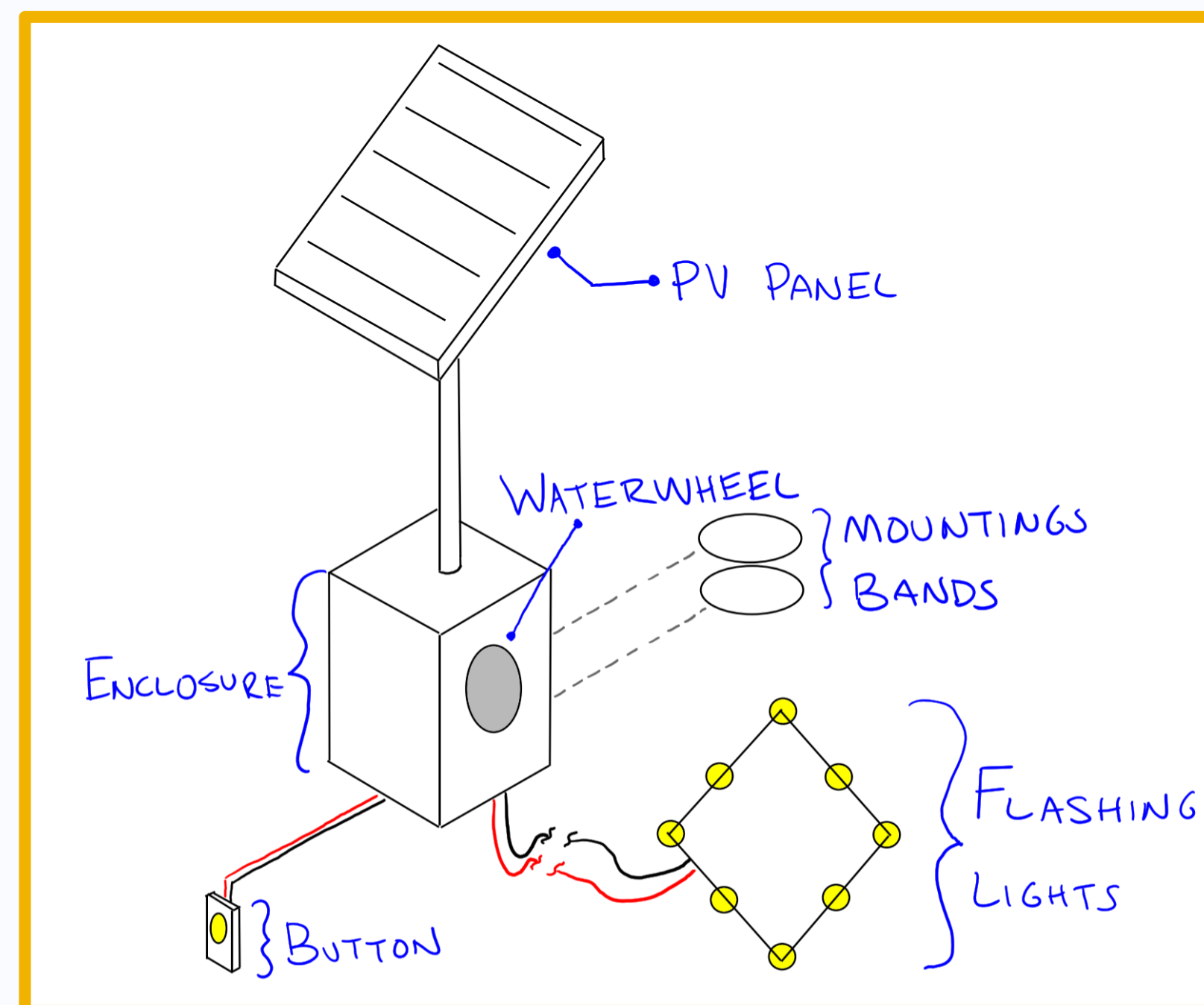
## CONCLUSION
