Building on the data acquisition system designed by a 2018-2019 senior design team design a test bed and test plan for testing generator performance during power swings, especially those near boundary of pole slipping

Page 6 Banana Plug

We use the same brand standard banana plug as the power lab for future replacement and use.

Features

- Designed to fit on the end of any 22 AWG to 18 AWG wire.
- Cross hole wire entry fits wires up to .12" (3mm) diameter.
- Available with tarnish resistant nickel or gold plating for very low contact resistance.
- Model 4899 is rated to temperatures up to +302°F (+150°C).
- Set screw simplifies assembly of test leads and jumpers by using a flat blade screwdriver.

2) All hard devices are fit on the front board making them easy to disconnect and connect.
