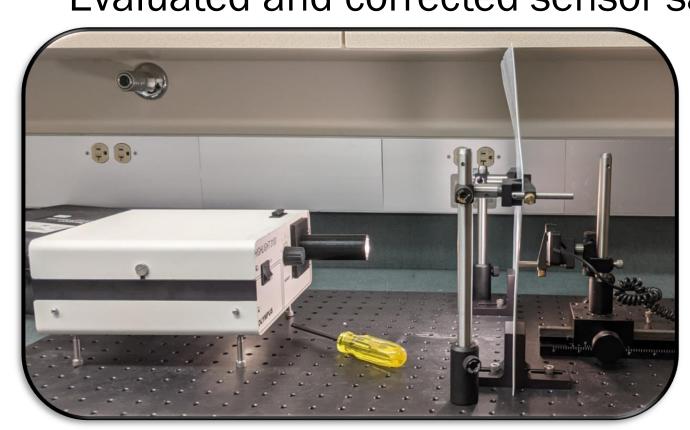

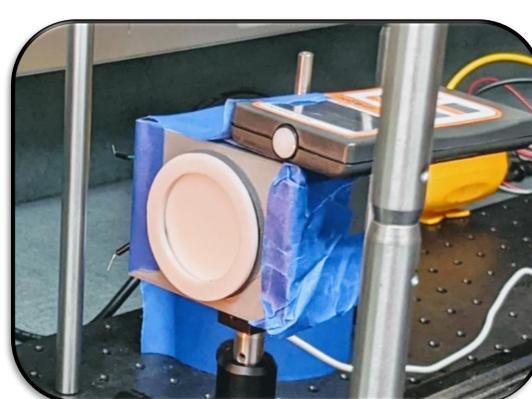

Solar panels require continuous maintenance and monitoring.

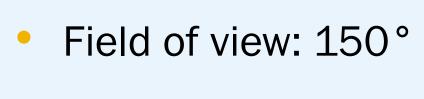
- Pyranometers are installed alongside solar panels

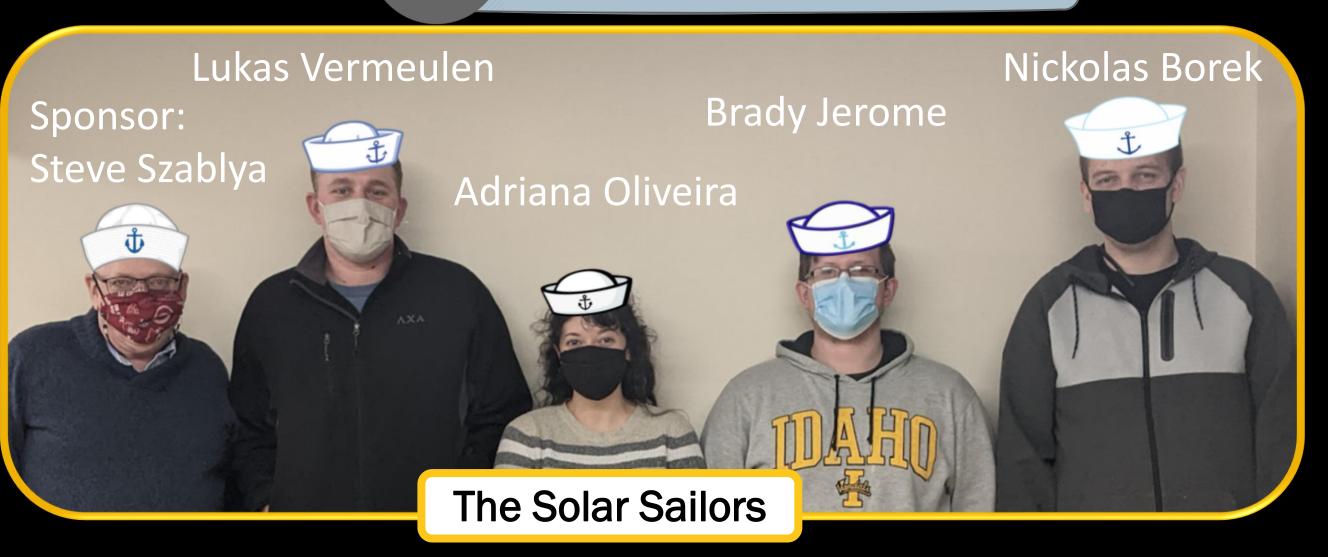

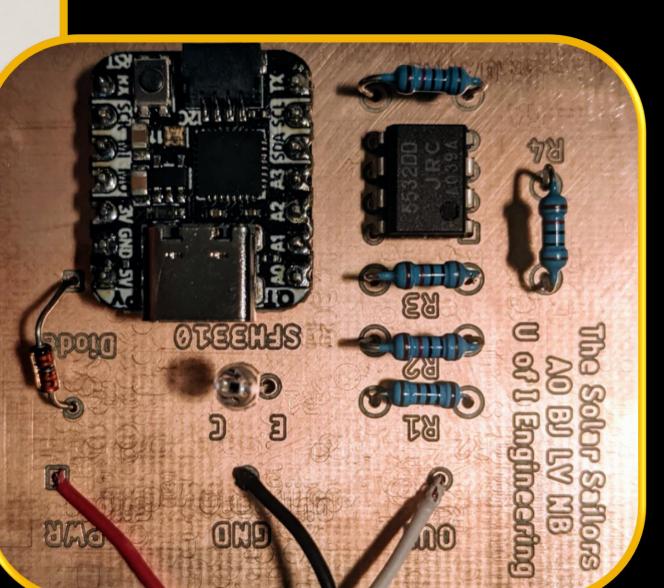
