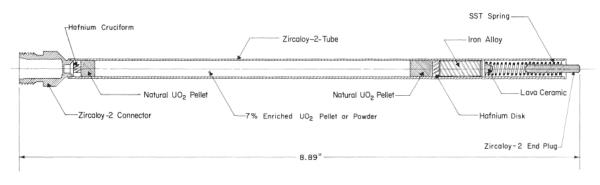
### The Response of UO<sub>2</sub> Fuel Rods to Power Bursts

IN-1302

- Question: What happens when fuel rods react with no cooling system in place?
- Rod Dimensions

GEX FUEL ROD ASSEMBLY

- Energy Release
  - "A clean fuel rod of the type in question, is irradiated in the CDC (steady state) until a specific energy of about 200 cal/g UO<sub>2</sub> has been released."
  - "Measurement of the energy deposition in any test is defined as the maximum possible adiabatic enthalpy change of the fuel."
- Failure



**COMPLETE CLADDING FAILURE, TEST 524** 

- Fuel status before and after tests was checked using neutron radiography.
- Results
  - Failure threshold between 266 and 292 cal/g UO<sub>2</sub>
  - Axial cladding displacement, elongation, and pressure are functions of energy deposition

### Behavior of Zircaloy Fuel Rods Subjected to Power Bursts

IN-ITR-107

- Question: What is the failure threshold for Zircaloy-2 fuel rods?
- Rod Dimensions

	SPXM Rods
Cladding	Zr-2
Outer Diameter (in)	0.25
Cladding Thickness (in)	0.014
Fuel Length Active (in)	5
Overall Length (in)	7.662

- Actual fuel rods are 18 24" long, and deformation and energy release by the fuel varies widely over the length of the rod. The 5" rod removes this variance and the cladding on the active length reacts uniformly.
- Theoretical enthalpy of 269 cal/g UO<sub>2</sub> required to reach Zr-2 melting point of 2842°C.
- Results
  - Mathematical Models for mechanical energy conversion, surface to volume particle size, and metal-water reaction extent
  - Failure Thresholds
    - Initial Failure (brittle fracture): 240 / 257 cal/g UO<sub>2</sub>
    - Melting Failure: 257 / 267 cal/g UO<sub>2</sub>
    - Prompt Failure (fracture before heat transfer): 338 / 360 cal/g UO<sub>2</sub>
  - When the rods fail, the fuel is retaining the heat because there's only about a 25 msec window to transfer it before complete failure.

### Measurements of the Reaction of UO2 With Water

- Question: What kind of reactions happen when molten UO2 is released in water?

#### - Results

• Failure thresholds range from 70 - 91% of total energy deposition

### Effects of Axial Length on Fuel Rods' Response to Power Bursts IN-ITR-109

- Question: Is an axial fuel length of 5" enough to accurately simulate real fuel performance?

### - Results

- 5" rods exhibit more severe reactions than long rods, because the average energy deposition was lower per unit length in long rods than for the short rods.
- Axial fuel length of 5" is sufficient for testing.

### **New Questions**

- What will this new round of experiments look like? What are the specific objectives?
- What is the material of the rods we'll be examining?
- What levels of fuel energy deposition will be tested? Are you testing for failure?
- Should we be expecting to handle fractured samples? In the final application, will those fractured samples be potentially leaking fuel?
- Is determining fuel fragmentation part of our project? If so, could thermal imaging be used?
- Will our test bench need to accommodate additional lengths?
- What is the cool down period like for these rods before testing?
