## **PROBLEM STATEMENT**

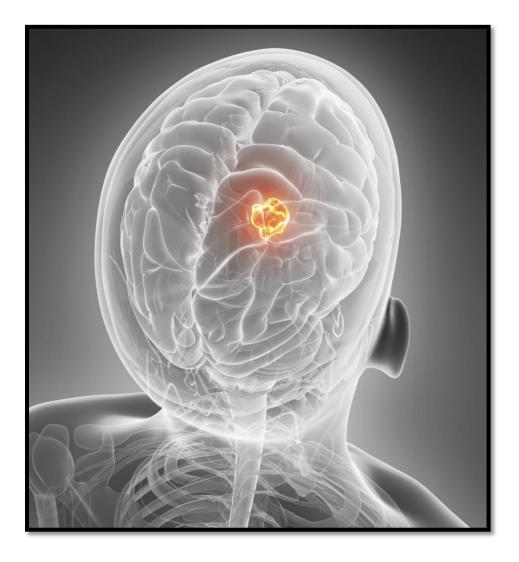
Create a precise, sanitary, and safe brain stiffness inspection method

1. Subjective measurement

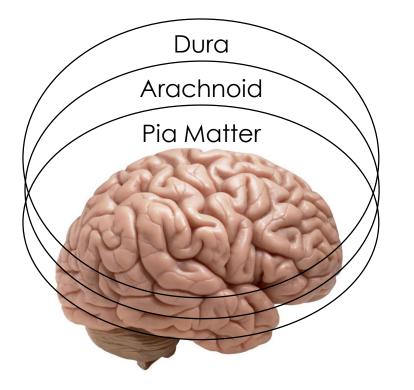

  - Angle compensation





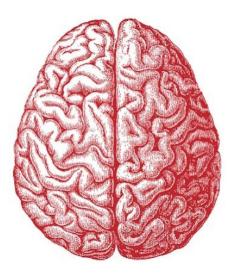

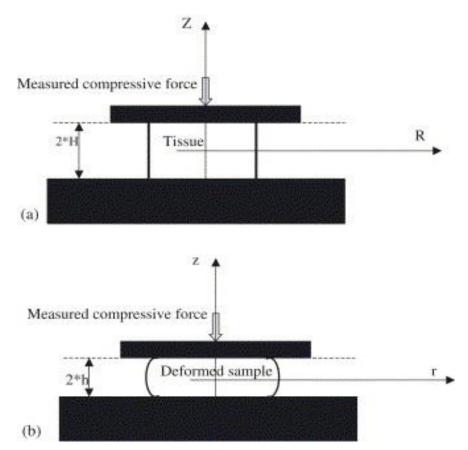

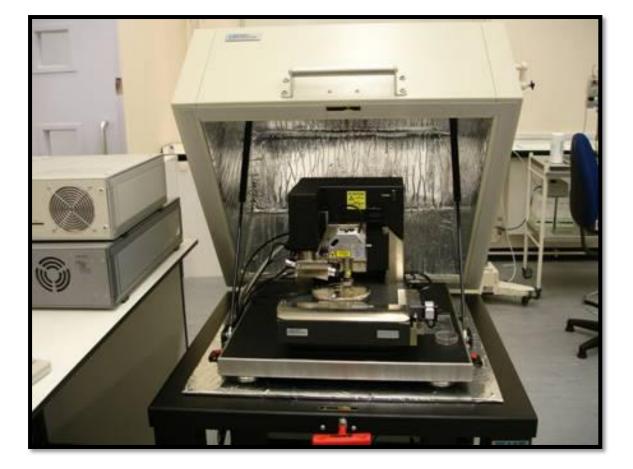
Confined vs. Unconfined

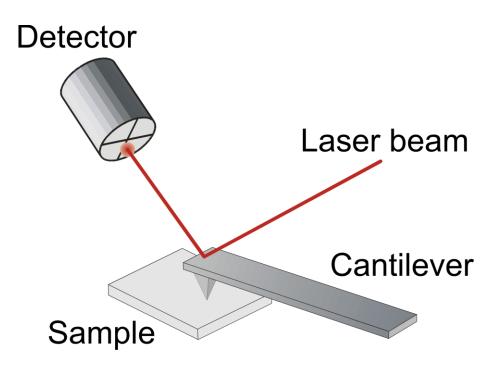




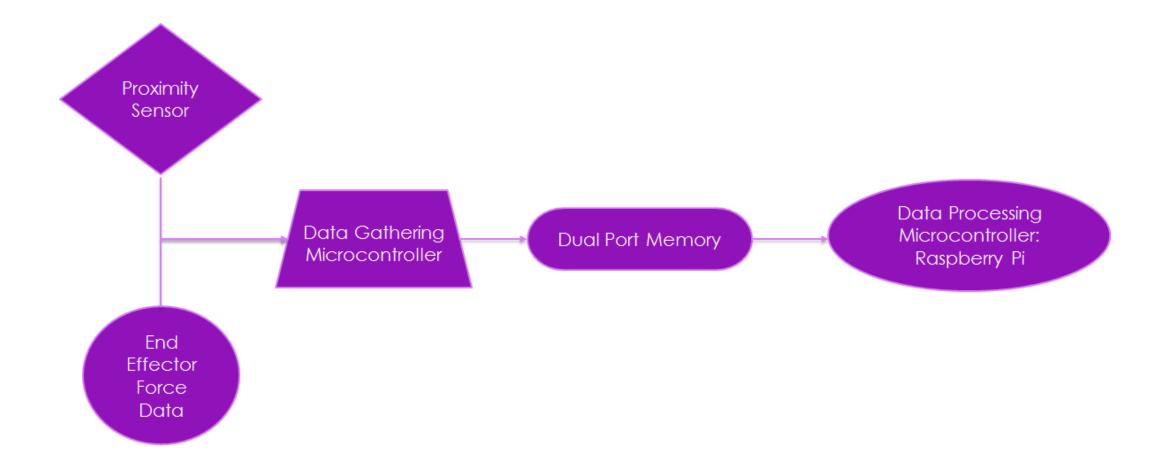

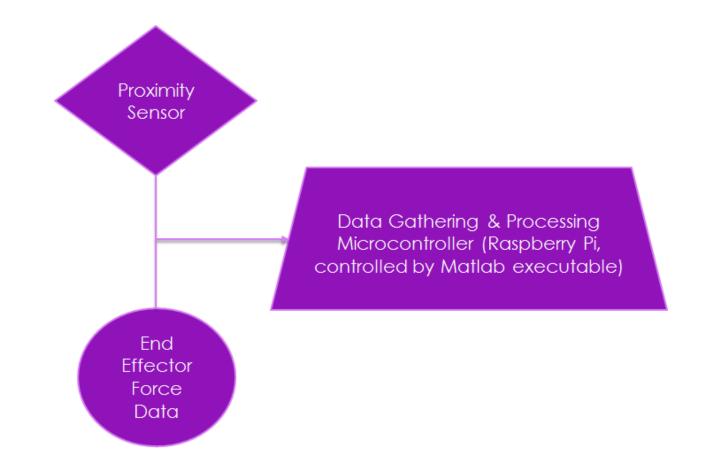

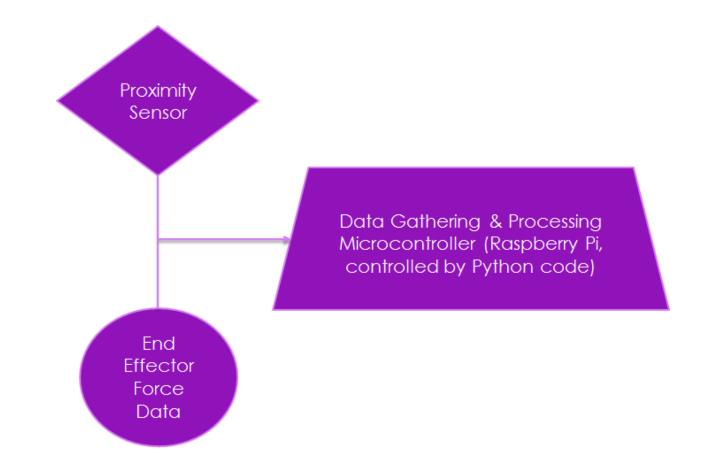

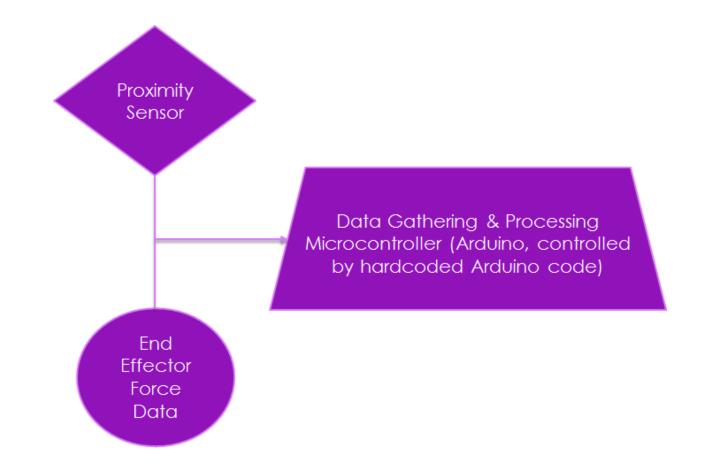
