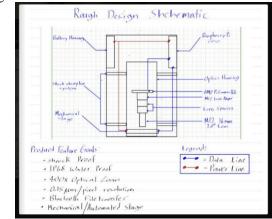

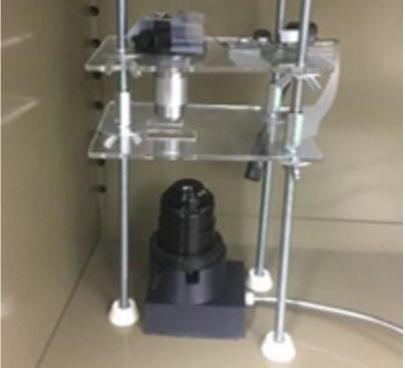
- Received permission from Dr. Peng to use EP 403 to store our project parts.
