CURRENT STATE

- Engine controller has fixed number of sensors/systems
- Can't add new functionality for engine controls
- Extra systems added with microcontrollers
- Holds back innovation







Value Proposition

- Replicate and expand existing ECU functionality
- Allow space for extra sensors and systems
- Allow more advanced control







Objective

- Develop connectivity between sensor inputs and a control system using a Pi-Innovo OpenECU
- Evaluate the functionality of the engine control unit (ECU) using a simulated engine
- Create meaningful long-term documentation in the process

Values for injection timing/quantity, spark timing, etc. are determined using 2D maps





CORRECTION/COMPENSATION TABLE EXAMPLE

- 1D lookup tables modify the nominal value of the main 2D lookup table
- Allows the engine to adapt to ambient or adverse conditions







Validation Procedure

- Input and output signals are connected and communicating to each other
- 2. Input signal reads as expected
- 3. Output signal reads as expected
- 4. Signal processing properly converts input signal to usable output signal
- 5. Input and output signals properly resolve to crank timing when applicable
- 6. Run signal(s) in virtual engine to ensure functionality under realistic conditions
