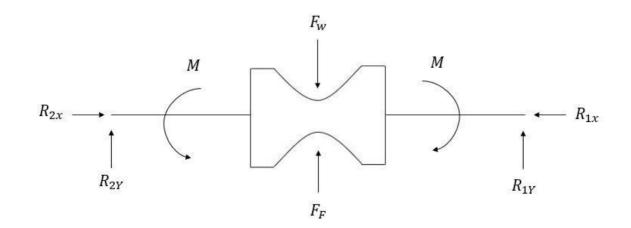

#### **Machining Plates**
