### 1 Project Scope

#### 1.1 General Expectations: What are you wanting us to accomplish (by the end of Summer)

High Level: We would like a shaker table on 2 axes (the ground plane) to disturb the drone. This should have changeable parameters in order to fully explore the performance of the drone.

The goal is to have a control system on the teeter totter, with the ability to mount it to the table and balance during a "disturbance".
