- We are provided with a function the uses a 9-axis system (accelerometer, gyroscope, magnetometer). It can take acceleration data from the orientation of the device and fit it to the Earth's frame of reference. Given in North, East and Up.

  - Got a suggestion on the discussion board suggesting we flash the binary file instead of elf file.
- The backup plan arrived consisting of: an Arduino, 2 Wi-Fi chips, 9 DOF (degree of freedom) sensor board, micro USB.

# Weekly Meeting #13 - 09/18/15

## Agenda

- Building working binaries and completed both sample (Freescale) labs.
- Alternative is wired up, starting software testing.

- After changing from UART0 to UART3 I was able to build a binary and successfully program the Freescale board!
  - o Going to start implementing Freescale sensor fusion library.
- The backup plan is going well.
  - Checking frame of reference for linear acceleration data.
  - Found a Google presentation on sensor fusion that may be helpful.
- Design review by the end of the month.

# Weekly Meeting #14 - 09/25/15

## Agenda

- Have some new thoughts on implementing an algorithm.
- Backup components seem to be working.

- We can use simple kinematics rather than extrapolation and integration to find our displacement from acceleration.
- Backup plan is working and wired up. Just need to write code to start getting data.

# Weekly Meeting #15 - 10/09/15

### Agenda

- Freescale:
  - o Implemented reset button and toggled LED's based on logic.
  - o Downloaded a newer Freescale library.
  - Waiting on response from Freescale for accessing sensor data
- Arduino:
  - o Figured out sensor API, working on code

- Having trouble accessing data from Freescale structures, waiting for a response from them.
- Arduino drivers are only written for orientation, not acceleration.
  - o Must read data directly from device.
  - Frame of reference is of the device, not of Earth.

# Weekly Meeting #16 - 10/16/15

## Agenda

- Have read Freescale acceleration in North/East/Up orientation, just need to implement algorithm.
- Bought some supplies for Arduino

- After including a couple .h files I am able to get acceleration data in North/East/Up orientation.
- Bought a button and serial cable for use with the Arduino.
- Arduino data is being saved into a csv and we have acceleration, velocity and displacement in the x, y, z direction of the device.

## Weekly Meeting #17 - 10/23/15

## Agenda

- Algorithm isn't working.
  - Can't visually access Freescale data.
  - Serial connection isn't outputting data.
- Getting strange readings from the Arduino.

- Need to check Putty settings for serial connection.
- Will see if changing directions will change the sign of acceleration readings.
- Arduino readings are too fast, getting very low velocities and almost no displacement.
- Might try multiplying by a factor to get larger numbers.
- Floating point might be too small to hold correct acceleration values.

# Weekly Meeting #18 - 10/30/15

### Agenda

- Took measurements with Freescale device using raw data.
  - o Data doesn't look very accurate.
- Fixed a small error in Arduino code.

- Freescale device thinks we moved 12 m in 5.8 seconds even though the board wasn't moving.
  - Will bring this up with Freescale.
- Also will check accelerometer documentation.
- Fixed a small software issue in Arduino code forgetting to have an output from a function.

# Weekly Meeting #19 - 11/06/15

### Agenda

- Freescale said accelerometers are rated to 30-50 mg's.
  - Are not suitable for finding displacement.
- Filtered acceleration is also not accurate.

- Walking 7 meters reported a displacement of 20-30 meters.
- Device is meant for accurate orientation, not acceleration.
- Will check repeatability of this data.
- May need to report more heavily on alternatives.
- See if others are using sensor fusion for tracking purposes.

# Weekly Meeting #20 - 11/13/15

## Agenda

- Orientation of device didn't change sign of acceleration.
- Repeatability doesn't look great.

- 0.04 seconds adds 10 m difference in distance.
- May use physics lab to test the acceleration with pseudo-frictionless cart track.
  - Drop weight attached to cart, acceleration should read  $9.8 \text{ m/s}^2$ .
- Include in final report details about how we solved problems from the spring and if we solve more current problems.

# Weekly Meeting #21 - 11/20/15

## Agenda

• Did 1g acceleration experiment and results were not as expected.

- We could try running this experiment in different environments.
- Look into how a drone uses accelerometers.
- Look further into alternatives.
- Look at how the device is calibrated.
- Document any tests we ran
- Document pedometer applications.
