- Nick's discussion on thermistors
  - o The pros
    - Affordable, accurate, and long lifespan
  - The cons
    - Non-linear relationship (tricky to work with)
- Lukas's discussion on thermopiles
  - More expensive
  - o Basic for our use (widely used and useful)
  - o Tests the effects of light rather than light itself
- Brady's discussion on photodiodes
  - Very cheap (especially in bulk)
  - o Good ranges (between 400nm and 1000nm in general)
  - o Misses out on some light, and has a max of 120° viewing angle
    - But works for what is needed
- Adriana's discussion on phototransistors

- Very cheap
- Good ranges (temp and wavelength)
- Good output voltage
- Useful mounting techniques
  - Through hole
  - Surface mount
- Decided on using phototransistors as our primary sensor
- Adriana asked about the transfer of data to the kw4h logs
  - We will be taking an analog signal, manipulating it, and output another analog signal
- Discussed the possibility of using the environmental chamber
  - o Can reach temperatures of -40°C to 140°C
  - o Can test humidity and anything else needed
