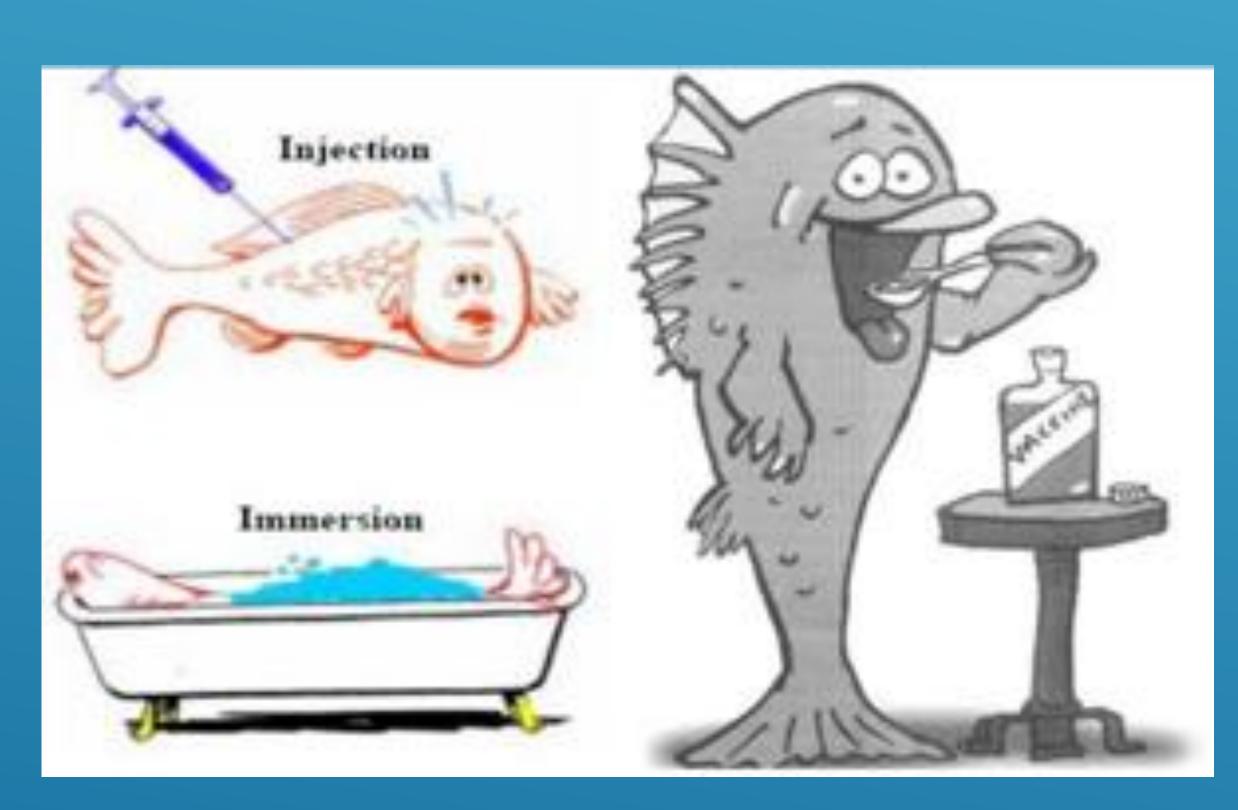
ALTERNATE AQUACULTURE VACCINE DELIVERY SYSTEM

Background and Objective:

- •3 methods for vaccination (Injection, Immersion, Oral)
 •It's known that fish with a fin removed or puncture in the skin prior to immersion have an increased vaccine uptake
- •It is our goal to develop a device that combines the injection and immersion processes to increase vaccine uptake in fish while remaining humane and time efficient



Key Requirements:

- •Should contain non-specific parts where possible to allow for easy repair
- •Two Prototypes (Lab model and production model)
- Product should be adjustable to vaccinate a variety of different sized fish
- Humane method of puncturing the fish

Test 3: Initial prototype 9/30/2020

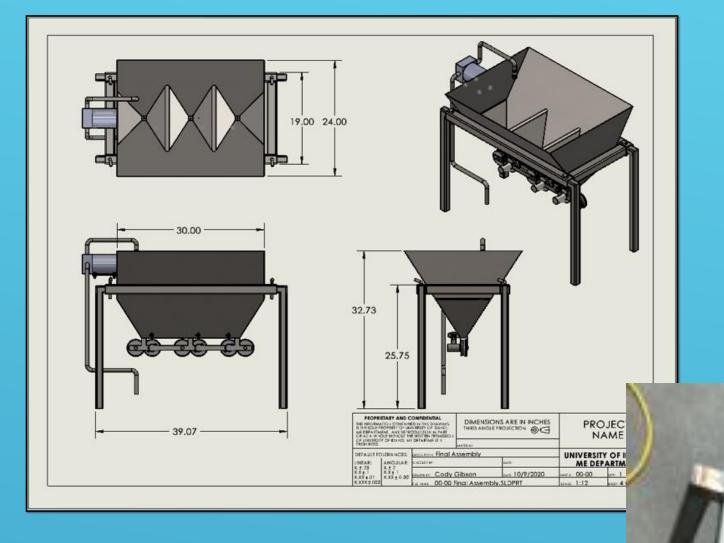
• 3D printed rollers with hypodermic needles: Test Success
