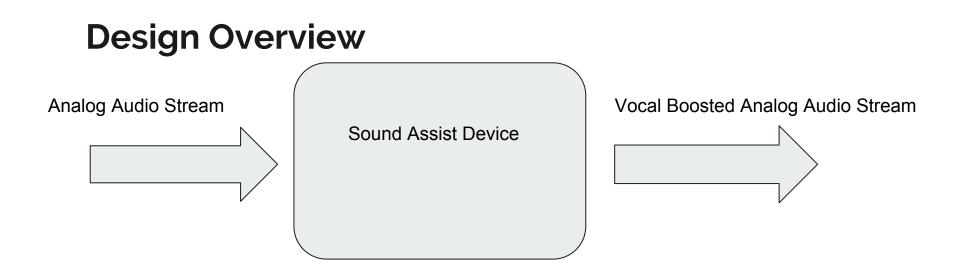
Project goal

-The device *must* increase the intelligibility of human speech.

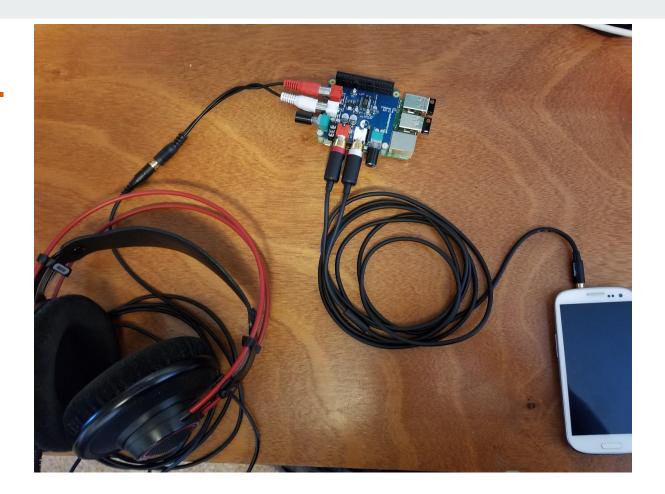
-The device *should* be customizable to suit the needs of individual users.

-The device may include a wireless transmission system.

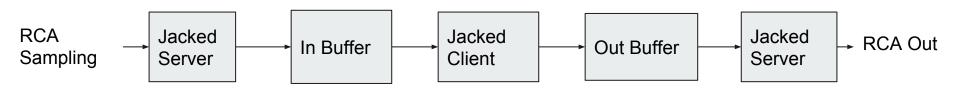


Hardware Design overview



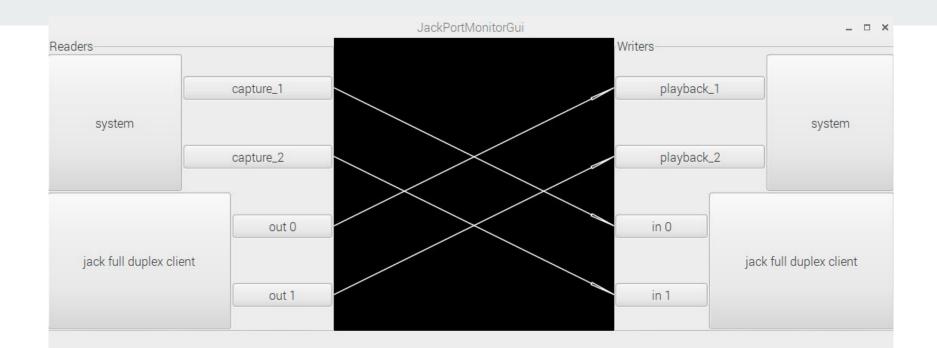


Software Design Overview

Advanced options

- **Degenerate Unmixing Estimation Technique (DUET)** is a Blind Source Separation Algorithm for stereo audio.
- It can separate a stereo mixture into an arbitrary number of components
- It appears to remove about 60% of the background noise from various samples.
- Degrades audio quality some, but should be unnoticable once remixed with original signal.
