- Start with a recap of the 09/16/2020 meeting
- Discussed a few new options that have come up
 - Excluding a microcontroller in place for a script design and circuit design
 - Decided that we will most likely need to use a microcontroller to be able to transfer the data to kw4h
 - o Lukas discussed Op Amp usage for a V-I converter
 - Voltage amplifier that utilizes the sensor output voltage, then gets passed into the V-I converter
 - Current becomes directly proportional to the output voltage.
 - However, the V-I converter is dependent on a thermopile
 - Nick discussed the potential of using a thermistor instead of a thermopile, as they are more accurate and can cost a little bit cheaper.
 - We would utilize a hot and cold thermistor to get two different outputs from them and compare the two voltages
 - It does have a 10 year lifespan for some of them, so it would not meet our lifespan requirement
 - Adrianna discussed sensors of different wavelengths
 - Discussed how the sensor needs to work between a certain wavelength
 - Gave our sensor a lower wavelength so that they are a little cheaper and still does its job.
- All members will have a task of looking into different components to compare them
 - Get five different products for each member's component and include the component's requirements
 - Nick- thermistors
 - Lukas- thermopiles
 - o Brady- photodiodes
 - Adriana- phototransistors
