Value Proposition

- About 8% of children need speech therapy globally and while there are many speech therapy apps intended to help these children, most only supplement typical sessions, require a therapist to use, or are of little use for research.
- This project's aim has been to create an all-in-one computer application for speech therapy utilizing last year's database system by implementing: a dynamic user-interface, an overhauled security system, and features useful to children, therapists, and researchers, alike.







Project Requirements

- Create a user interface system for therapists, researchers, caregivers, and patients
- Expand upon security to keep the project on track for COPPA and HIPAA compliance
- Give therapists, caregivers, and researchers **viewability** of patient **records**
- Allow for the **upload** of patient **audio** files
- Create a back-end server to handle data transfer and to control the security layer







The Previous Project



- A relational-database design was created last year for the project to establish storage for the data to used in the application
- It established a MySQL database hosted in Google Cloud that could be accessed through a Java application
- We built our application back-end in Java so we could easily interact with their system and to setup the communication for future work

Front-end Module

- In Angular, a module is a mechanism to group components, directives, pipes and services that are related, in such a way that can be combined with other modules to create an application.
- Module is a function that takes metadata object whose properties describe the module. Modules are

defined using the @NgModule decorator.





Front-end Component

- Components are like the basic building block in an Angular application.
- Components are defined using the @component decorator.
- A component has a selector, template, style and other properties, using which it specifies the metadata required to process the component.

- The security layer was developed in **Java** using **Spring Security** libraries
- Back-end
 - Request filter
 - Token generator
 - Authentication controller
- Front-end
 - Requestinterceptor
 - Authentication guard
