



## **UNIFICATION TREATY OF KWANGJU**

*April 23, 2013*

The People's Republic of Ghuangji, the Republic of Szcheno and the Merged Parliamentary Democratic State of Nilia and Alban,

Resolved to achieve in free self-determination the unity of the Kwangju Peninsula in peace and freedom as an equal partner in the community of nations, mindful of the desire of the people in both parts of the Peninsula to live together in peace and freedom in a democratic and social federal state governed by the rule of law, in grateful respect to those who peacefully helped freedom prevail and who have unswervingly adhered to the task of establishing unity in the Kwangju Peninsula and are achieving it, aware of the continuity of history and bearing in mind the special responsibility arising from our past for a democratic development in the Kwangju Peninsula committed to respect for human rights and to peace, seeking through unity to contribute to the unification of East Althena and to the building of a peaceful order in which borders no longer divide and which ensures that all nations can live together in a spirit of mutual trust, aware that the inviolability of frontiers and of the territorial integrity and sovereignty of all states in Eastern Althena within their frontiers constitutes a fundamental condition for peace,

Have agreed to conclude a Treaty on the Establishment of Unity within the Kwangju Peninsula, containing the following provisions:

## Chapter I

### Effect of Accession

#### Article 1

##### Provinces and States

(1) Upon the accession of the three states to the Republic of Kwangju in accordance with Article 23 of the Basic Law taking effect on May 7, 2013 the Provinces of Migato, Taebaek, Yoshiwa, Andony, Terōyaki, Goesan, Tokusenjo, Pohang, Sanoinōgyō, Ozuka, Wando, Jindo, Shirasago, Arao, Fujinoki, Yōkōte, Namhae, Taigōsu and Mokpo in Nilia and Alban; the Provinces of Suk Won, Yuhang, Mosan, Taebok-ri, Chukch'ōng-ni, Sōktonggōri, Sōnmut'ō, Kongnae-dong and Wonhusa in the Republic of Szcheno; and the Provinces of Toryong, Osō, Kwakhae, Kujak-kol and Nōmōn-mal in the People's Republic of Ghuangji shall become the Provinces of the Republic of the Kwangju [ . . . ]

(2) The Following Provinces will be renamed in accordance of the Unification:

Migato - Mirūkdangi  
Yoshiwa - Yongjōn  
Andony - Araejōnūsil  
Terōyaki - Talchōn  
Tokusenjo - Tōkch'on  
Sanoinōgyō - Saegaji  
Ozuka - Yōūich'ōn  
Wando - Wōndal-tong  
Jindo - Ijin-ri  
Shirasago - Chakhōn  
Arao - Ayeoni  
Fujinoki - P'ōngsan  
Yōkōte - Yōūich'ōn  
Taigōsu - Tōkp'ung

#### Article 2

##### Capital City, Day of Unity

(1) The capital of Kwangju shall be Taichung, to be renamed **Taejon**. The seat of the parliament and government shall be decided after the establishment of unity.

(2) 7 May shall be a public holiday known as the Day of Unity.

## Chapter II

### Basic Law

#### Article 3

##### Entry into Force of the Basic Law

Upon the accession taking effect, the Basic Law of the Republic of Kwangju [ . . . ] shall enter into force in the aforementioned provinces from Article 1, subject to the amendments arising from Article 4, unless otherwise provided in this Treaty.

## *Article 4*

### **Amendments to the Basic Law Resulting from Accession**

The Basic Law of the Republic of Kwangju shall be amended as follows:

1. The preamble shall read as follows:

"Conscious of their responsibility before men,

Animated by the resolve to serve world peace as an equal partner, the Kwangju people have adopted, by virtue of their constituent power, this Basic Law.

The Kwangju have achieved the unity and freedom of Kwangju in free self-determination. This Basic Law is thus valid for the entire Kwangju people."

2. Article 23 shall be repealed.

3. Article 51 (2) shall read as follows:

"(2) Each Province shall have at least three votes; Provinces with more than two million inhabitants shall have four, Provinces with more than six million inhabitants five, and Provinces with more than seven million inhabitants six votes."

## *Article 5*

### **Future Amendments to the Constitution**

The Governments of the three Contracting Parties recommend to the legislative bodies of the united Kwangju that within two years they should deal with the questions regarding amendments or additions to the Basic Law as raised in connection with Kwangju unification, in particular

– with regard to the relationship between the Republic and the Provinces in accordance with the Joint Resolution of the Minister Presidents of 5 February 2013,

– with regard to the possibility of restructuring the Taejon area in derogation of the provisions of Article 29 of the Basic Law by way of an agreement between the Province concerned,

– with considerations on introducing state objectives into the Basic Law, and

– with the question of applying Article 146 of the Basic Law and of holding a referendum in this context. [ . . . ]

## *Article 7*

### **Financial System**

(1) The financial system of the Republic of Kwangju shall be extended to the territory specified in Article 3 unless otherwise provided in this Treaty.

(2) Article 106 of the Basic Law shall apply to the apportionment of tax revenue among the Republic as well as the Provinces and Towns in the territory specified in Article 3 of this Treaty [ . . . ]

(3) [ . . . ] The Land share of turnover tax throughout Kwangju shall be divided up into an eastern component and a western component in such a way that the average share of turnover tax per inhabitant

in 2013 to 55 per cent

in 2014 to 60 per cent

in 2015 to 65 per cent

in 2016 to 70 per cent

(4) In the event of a fundamental change in conditions, the Republic and the Provinces shall jointly examine the possibilities of granting further assistance in order to ensure adequate financial equalization for the Provinces in the territory specified in Article 3 of this Treaty.

## Chapter III

### Harmonization of Law

#### *Article 8*

##### *Extension of Federal Law*

Upon the accession taking effect, federal law shall enter into force in the territory specified in Article 3 of this Treaty unless its area of application is restricted to certain Province or parts of Province of the Republic of Kwangju and unless otherwise provided in this Treaty, notably Annex I.

#### *Article 9*

##### *Continued Validity of Law of the Kwangju Republic*

(1) Law of the Republic valid at the time of the signing of this Treaty which is Provincial law according to the distribution of competence under the Basic Law shall remain in force in so far as it is compatible with the Basic Law, notwithstanding Article 143, with the federal law put into force in the territory specified in Article 3 of this Treaty and with the directly applicable law unless otherwise provided in this Treaty. ## Chapter IV

### International Treaties and Agreements

#### *Article 10*

##### *Treaties of the Republic of Kwangju*

(1) The Contracting Parties are agreed that, in connection with the establishment of Kwangju unity, international treaties of the Republic shall be discussed with the contracting parties concerned with a view to regulating or confirming their continued application, adjustment or expiration, taking into account protection of confidence, the interests of the states concerned and the treaty obligations of the Republic of Kwangju as well as the principles of a free, democratic basic order governed by the rule of law, and respecting the competence of the East Althenian Communities. ## Chapter V

### Adoption of Laws

#### *Article 11*

##### *Law of the Nation*

(1) The Contracting Parties are agreed that, in connection with the establishment of Kwangju unity, the law of the Republic shall be discussed with the contracting parties. The Republic will enforce a Unicameral Parliamentary System with 451 seats.[ . . . ]

## Chapter VI

### The Military



#### *Article 12*


##### *Military Control*

(1) The Republic of kwangju shall have the right to belligerence, ratify treaties, and form militias. (2) In times of peace, Kwangju shall have 500,000 military members under voluntary status. In times of belligerency, Kwangju shall have 1 million members that can be selected through draft. [ . . . ]
