As Viru's career moved them around India, their breeding program adapted and grew based on the new climates and challenges they faced. But what did not change was the focus of their program. The book leaves no doubt about that and that is one of the delights in reading this book. I've always felt that laser focus is what makes a great rose breeder. Their program is evidence of that.

Later in the book they begin to discuss their rose journey's around the world. They are ever delightfully present at many rose events and conferences around the world. They discuss sharing and learning from so many new friends they make and old friends they re-encounter. I can personally attest they are a delight to be around and talk to. Both are very generous with their knowledge and experience.

You do not have to be into roses as much as some of us to enjoy this book. While it is about roses, it is also about the world of gardening.
